

NEWS FLASH More than half of new jobs created in EU since 2010 have been through temporary contracts. (Link)





- Up to 47% of jobs (15 mil) could be automated within 20 years
- Intelligent machines will outnumber humans by 2030
- Top 10 in demand jobs in 2010 did not exist in 2004
- 65% of school children today will end up doing jobs not yet invented




With a better understanding of "what is out there", a company is able to lower risk by combining external capabilities with internal innovation resources.



GIG ECONOMY

IS INCREASINGLY NETWORKED, COLLABORATIVE, FLEXIBLE Characteristics:

- Online platforms connect workers and customers
- Users work whenever they want
- A rate is paid for a specific task
- The payment is intermediated by the platform



SG's INDUSTRY TRANSFORMATION PLANS

- ITPS by sector drawn up.
- There are new job roles which require skilled professionals
- There is currently a shortage of specialised skills across many sectors
- Public-private partnerships are being forged to bring about innovation
- Firms are being incentivised to develop human capital (HCPP)
- There is a range of programmes and funding for companies and individuals to re-tool, re-skill and upskill themselves
- Many institutions including universities are co-opted to conduct skills training

Be prepared to go beyond fixed employment with one employer




